Billings County, located in the midst of the Badlands is comprised of 1152 square miles with approximately 52% of the lands owned by the State and Federal government. The main industries are ranching/agriculture, tourism and oil. The population is approximately 900 people. Billings County has many attractions and historical sites including the Theodore Roosevelt National Park (South Unit), Cowboy Hall of Fame and a museum. Other attractions are the Medora Musical and the Chateau DeMores.

The Recorder's office has digitized images, complete indexing and been exported to NDRIN from 1992 to present. The years going back are an ongoing change as we are back entering data as time allows on a daily basis. Documents may be found by book and page up until around October of 2004 and then we switched over to using the document number, starting with document number 122053.

All documents have been imaged back to approximately 1914. Searching maybe done by document number or book and page (the only data for these documents are the instrument type, document date, recording date, document number, book and page numbers). You may find older records with all the information due to complete indexing was also done while back scanning starting in fall of 2017.

Corner Records:

All records have been scanned and indexed and can be searched by legal description on NDRIN.

Subdivision Searches:

To search a subdivision enter the name of the city or county subdivision

City – subdivision name

Examples: County – Tetley

Medora – Southside Addition
