

## **SLOPE COUNTY – AMIDON, NORTH DAKOTA:**

The Slope County Courthouse is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 to 4:30 Mountain time year around. We are closed on official Holidays. We also are closed on the Friday after Thanksgiving and if Christmas falls on a Tuesday the courthouse will be closed on the Monday before Christmas.

Slope County currently has complete indexing and images dating from January, 2001 to present on the NDRIN website. There are a few random documents previous to this date that will show up on a search. The county also has all indexing and digitized images dating from January 1975 to present available on computers at the Slope County courthouse. We continue to work on getting the indexing and images back scanned on a daily basis as time allows.

The corner records are also indexed and imaged on the county computers but they are not on the NDRIN website at this time.

### **SEARCHING:**

You may search on NDRIN by instrument number, book and page, recording date, grantor, grantee, legal description as well as instrument type. When searching by instrument number you must enter a total of six digits. If the document does not contain six digits you must add leading zeros (0's) to the instrument number to add up to a total of six digits. EXAMPLE – if the document number is 4005 you would need to search for document 004005.

On February 1, 2003 the county did away with books and pages and went to strictly document numbers starting with document 088134. When searching for book and page use the following: for a deed book use the book number and the letter D – Example book 14D, for a miscellaneous book use the book number and the letters MC – Example book 32MC, for a mortgage book use the letters MG- Example book 20MG. The page numbers can be used as they appear so page 138 would be 138.

All government lots are indexed by the  $\frac{1}{4}$   $\frac{1}{4}$  section where they are located if they are listed on a document.

Some plat maps have been scanned if they are small enough for our scanner to handle. A project to complete the scanning of all plat maps is planned for the future.
